

Have you ever asked yourself "Who Am I really?" We go by many titles such as brother, sister, aunt, uncle neighbor, friend, pastor, teacher, etc., but is that truly who we are? After spending time at All Ohio School of Ministry I think the answer to that is no!

We had 2-1/2 days at Kalahari that was filled with worship, learning, praising and some fun. West OH and East OH clergy came together to get to know each other in anticipation of the possible merging into one conference in 2027. We shared communion, meals, laughter and tears.

We had an exceptional speaker, Rev. Dr. Javier A. Viera, president of Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, who encouraged and inspired us to be the voice the world needs through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Rev. Mark Chow, dean of the West Ohio Cabinet and superintendent of the Hocking River District, encouraged those gathered to remember their baptism and honor who does the work. "God is the actor in the sacred act of baptism. The pastor is not the lead actor, God is the one who acts," he said.

Bishop Hee-Soo Jung reiterated a vision for the future that he has been sharing with congregations across the state. "We are claiming a Divine-size dream in Ohio. God's dream is our prayer. We want to create new faith communities, not just hold onto something that we are now. We are going to continuously move into new possibilities. No more disruption, but opportunity. No more limitation, but dream together the strong vision of God," Bishop Jung said.

The importance of prayer was the focus of a passionate message from Rev. Angela Lewis, dean of the East Ohio Cabinet and superintendent of the Northern Waters District in East Ohio. "Every great move that's happened from the birth of the church, from the awakenings, from the camp meetings, from whatever – every great movement has been birthed, has been saturated, has been marinated in prayer! If we want something to happen in The UMC between the East and the West we better find an upper room and get together and start praying and hearing what the spirit of God wants us to do because we want this to be what God wants us to do and not just ourselves!" Lewis proclaimed.

Powerful words at a time when this world needs all the power of God we can get. Perhaps, however, the most important thing that was emphasized over and over and especially in Dr. Viera's closing words to us was that we are a beloved community that has three gifts to offer: love, connection and hope. How we treat one another by showing humility and being a public witness for Christ shows us being a beloved community.

So, when someone asks you who you are after you tell them your name and maybe what you do for a living, I hope you will tell them that the most important person you are is a Child of God living out a faith that is true and real for the transformation of the world. Amen and Amen.




